India's Jagadish Chandra Bose is the reason why the world will enjoy superfast 5G Inernet. In the evolution of digital communication tech, 5G is just around the corner. Yet, despite its more recent applications in the industry, the technology itself has a surprisingly long history, one rooted in India. And thanks to the critical contributions of Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose, the world will reap the benefits of 5G Internet very soon.

Italian inventor Guglielono Marconi is credited with first inventing the telegraph in 1895. However, at the same time that Marconi was pioneering the first commercial use of telegraphy as a communication, Indian polymath Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose was working to understand the nature of the phenomenon.

Born on 30 Nov, 1858 at Mymensingh, which is now in modern day Bangladesh. Sir Jagadish Chandra Bose attended Cambridge after studying Physics at Calcutta University. He was the first to demonstrate radio communication with millimetre wavelengths, which fall in the 30GH<sub>2</sub> to 300GH<sub>3</sub> spectrum.

Bose's outstanding contribution in this field are now finally getting him the recognition he deserves, as his studies form the basis of the evolving 5G Internet standard. The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineer (IEEE), the largest international body dedicated to advancement of technology, has recognised Bose's 1895 experiment demonstrating short wave communication as a milestone nearly 120 years later. Bose generated 5mm electromagnetic waves, 60GHz before instruments evolved to measure frequencies that low.
